Workforce Development

August was a month full of back-to-school celebrations across Ward 7, with local churches, service providers, and nonprofit partners coming together to support families as the new school year begins. Two standout events this month were the Places of Worship Advisory Board's Community Day (August 23) and the DC Prevention Center's International Overdose Awareness Week, co-hosted by MHCDO (August 24-31).

Both events underscored the importance of health, wellness, and prevention in our community. Residents had the opportunity to learn more about self-care, chronic disease prevention, and resources to address some of the leading causes of death in our neighborhoods, including heart disease, cancer, diabetes, and substance abuse. Organizers also distributed Narcan to help reverse overdoses, worked to reduce stigma, and honored families and friends who have lost loved ones.

Meanwhile, MHCDO's own Mary Dade, held a special session for seniors on financial literacy and preventing senior fraud - empowering older residents with practical tools to stay safe and secure.
